

Care Act Assessment

Many people would like to live independently in their own homes for as long as possible. However, in the future your situation may change, and you may find you need assistance with:

- Washing and dressing
- Meal preparation
- Managing your medications
- Doing things around your home and getting out into your local community

A care act assessment will explore:

- Your present circumstances
- Your strengths and current abilities
- What is working well for you
- What is not working so well at home

The assessment will summarise your needs and wishes. The assessor will look at your health and wellbeing, including any risks to you, and discuss how this can be managed. A professional opinion will follow regarding eligibility for support from Suffolk County Council. Care and support may be available from other organisations which may be more appropriate to meet your needs which the assessor can signpost you to, such as local charities.

Medequip Connect Suffolk

Medequip work across the Suffolk county, offering services in monitoring and response as part of the technology enabled care (TEC) service. This allows for emergency support in the event of an accident, such as a fall and needing assistance to get up. Medequip can help you from the floor if you are uninjured. They have access to lifting aids, so there is no need for an ambulance as long as you are not injured.

They also offer wellbeing visits, whether you have just left hospital, or a family member is away. In these circumstances, they can organise for one of their trained responders to visit you at a pre-arranged time that best suits you. In addition to this, they offer a wellbeing call service that can offer reassurance or medication prompts. This allows peace of mind for you or your family member.

Community equipment service:

In the future, should you need adaptive equipment to help you maintain your independence at home, Medequip provide equipment on loan. Your local service centre is in Ipswich, where they run the Suffolk integrated community equipment service.

This includes delivery, fitting, servicing, collection and recycling. To access equipment, you will need to have an occupational therapy assessment. You can ask your GP for a referral. To enquire or request an assessment, please call the care coordination centre (CCC) on:

Wheelchair services:

The wheelchair service is hosted for the whole of Suffolk by the West Suffolk NHS Foundation Trust. The Trust's clinical staff undertake assessments and fittings. Rosscare is the approved repairer and is also responsible for deliveries and collections.

Do you qualify for a wheelchair assessment from Suffolk wheelchair service?

- Do you have a Suffolk GP?
- Do you need a wheelchair for more than six months?
- Will you use the wheelchair four times a week or more?
- Do you have a medical condition which affects your ability to walk in the home or outdoors?

If you answered yes to all of these questions, you should ask your GP, physiotherapist or occupational therapist to complete a referral. Alternatively, if you are known to the service as an existing client, you can self-refer by contacting the service by telephone or completing the paper referral form online and submitting this to the service directly.

Community Alarms

A community alarm is a pendant a person wears round their neck or on their wrist. When pressed, the pendant will call a response team which raised the need for help and they can then contact an assigned next of kin, neighbour or the emergency services. This provides comfort and peace of mind for the service users and their loved ones, especially in the event of a fall or a medical emergency.

There are multiple community alarm services in Suffolk. Some companies also offer the provision of a key safe so that trusted people can access your home in an emergency.

Access to community alarms is dependent on which district council area you live in a there is a weekly charge for their services.

Community nurses visit those who are house bound and require health treatment to avoid unnecessary admission to hospital. District nurses can support with, among other services:

- Wound Care
- Medication management
- Catheter care
- Post operative care
- Management of long-term conditions
- Teaching self-administration of insulin and catheter care

The community nursing team works closely with GP's, acute hospitals to support discharges, adult social care, and link with voluntary services. The Suffolk district nursing services can be accessed via the care coordination centre.

Good Neighbour Scheme

Good Neighbour schemes are run by local people to provide day-to-day support for other residents in their community, who occasionally may need help. This could be:

- Assisting with transportation to and from medical appointments, shops or place of employment
- Getting food shopping
- Support with filling in documents or accessing technology
- Help in the house or garden
- Befriending service
- Advice on local services, groups, activities and local trades
- Planning outings and social events such as coffee mornings

Social Prescribing

Social prescribing schemes can involve a variety of activities which are usually provided by voluntary and community sector organisations. Examples include:

- Volunteering
- Arts activities
- Group learning
- Gardening
- Befriending
- Cookery and healthy eating advice

Most social prescribing services involve a link worker, navigator or connector who works with people to access local sources of support. You can self-refer, or your GP or other healthcare staff may refer you. For this reason, there isn't a central Suffolk social prescribing contact.
